

## 22216VIC Certificate II in Building and Construction (Carpentry Stream) Preapprenticeship (Partial Completion) Course Information Brochure



This course is subject to change in 2018.

### Description of Course

This course is a partial completion of the Certificate with 8 core units related to the building industry and 12 elective units introducing carpentry. It covers basic knowledge in safety and basic carpentry and building skills to prepare students for work in the building trades.

### Activities/tasks

- Basic building concepts, theory and terminology
- Using hand and power tool skills for various carpentry team and individual projects
- Timber construction projects eg. saw horses, dog house & small portable or fixed dwelling
- Working safely in the construction industry
- Calculations for the building industry
- Levelling
- First Aid - is delivered by Premium Health at the NCAT

### Assessment

Practical project work, theory tests and design folios/briefs are all assessed using a set criteria. Students are required to undertake a minimum of 80 hours of Structured Workplace Learning.

Students are given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes the option of an assessment re-sit. If students are still not competent after the re-sit then a fee will be charged, this fee will be the same as for RPL.

### Eligibility and prerequisites

A minimum sound achievement of Year 10 Maths and English or equivalent and an aptitude for practical work is recommended. If you have individual needs please contact the college.

### Benefits of this training

This course is an introduction to the Building and Construction industry and a pathway into an apprenticeship in this area. Completing the program may provide exemptions from subjects studied in the first year of the Building & Construction apprenticeship.

The course helps students make an informed choice of vocation or career path.

### Pathways

The course is an excellent foundation in the construction industry and a pathway for CPC30211 Certificate III in Carpentry and an apprenticeship.

### Course Fees

VET students from other schools have separate fee arrangements with their own schools for VET course costs. All training resources are provided when classes commence. NCAT students please see the Payment Form - Material Charges.

For safety reasons there is a NCAT uniform for this course which is not included in the materials cost. Parents will receive a letter outlining specific details of the uniform and the supplier.

### Length of the Course

This program can be completed as a NCAT VCAL Pre-apprenticeship program over one year.

Alternatively, it can be completed as part of a Year 10, VCAL or VCE program for one half day per week over two years. Students are provided with a schedule and training plan for completing assessment tasks for each unit.

### Enrolment Process

Students enrolling as full time students must contact the college on Tel 9478 1333 for an interview. External students must apply through the VET coordinator at their home school and complete the enrolment form at the NCAT information evening.
