

22305VIC Certificate III in Musical Instrument Making and Maintenance



Course Information Brochure

Activities/tasks

After an extensive OH&S program, incorporating theory and workshop induction, students will build an electric guitar neck, a cajon (percussion instrument), a xylophone, repair a snare drum and a clarinet, make a flageolet, a traverse flute and an electric slide guitar. In the second year the students build a tenor ukulele, a tenor acoustic guitar and a solid body electric guitar.

Assessment

The course runs over two years. In the first year you will be required to have completed two instruments and an introductory piece. In the second year you will be required to have completed two instruments and various instrument repairs. A folio demonstrating work development and research will also be required for assessment in this year. Because of the applied nature of the program, 98% attendance is expected to successfully complete the course. The assessment of your overall competence at this certificate level will be undertaken by a qualified assessor and your competence judged using all of these completed tasks.

Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes the option of an assessment re-sit. If students are still not yet competent after the re-sit then a fee will be charged.

Length of the Course

This program runs for one day per week. Students completing this as part of their Year 10, VCAL or VCE program will complete the program over two years. You will be provided with a schedule and training plan for completing assessment tasks for each unit.
