

22569VIC Certificate II in Plumbing (Pre-apprenticeship) Course Information Brochure



Description of Course

The course covers the knowledge and skills to prepare students for an entry into an apprenticeship. There is a strong practical focus. A range of units to introduces students to basic plumbing knowledge and skills and the opportunity to develop skills for the industry in the plumbing workshop. There is a strong emphasis on sustainability and safe plumbing principles.

Activities/tasks

During the course, students will be able to complete projects that include:

- Sheet metal work
- Plumbing fixtures and fittings for domestic and commercial applications
- Technical drawing and plumbing specifications
- Levelling
- Tubes and pipes in plumbing

Assessment

Assessments include the completion of written and practical assessments for each unit including observed assessment. Students are encouraged to do a minimum of 80 hours Structured Workplace Learning.

Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.

Eligibility and prerequisites

It is recommended students have a minimum sound achievement of Year 10 Maths and English or equivalent and an aptitude for practical work. If you have individual needs please contact the college.

Students will be enrolled for the first aid unit with **1 SDO TRAINING (RTO Number **41558**) and they will deliver the certificates. Their trainers will deliver the unit at NCAT.

Length of the Course

The course can be completed as a NCAT Pre-apprenticeship program over one year OR as an external student (through their home school) for half day per week over two years.

Benefits of this training

This certificate II course is for students wanting an introduction to the Plumbing/Building industry. It may assist people experiencing difficulties in gaining a full-time apprenticeship.

Completing the program can also provide credits from subjects studied in the first year of a Plumbing apprenticeship. In addition, it can reduce the study workload for such courses.

The course helps students make an informed choice of vocation or career path.

Pathways

This course provides an excellent foundation and pathways to certificate III courses in Plumbing or other building industry level III qualifications. Following the successful completion of the course you can pursue an apprenticeship or traineeship.

Some of the opportunities available in the Plumbing industry include:

- General – water, drainage, gas fitting, sanitary.
- Mechanical Service – ventilation, duct fixing, heating/air-conditioning
- Domestic and commercial plumbing

Course Fees

External VET students from other schools have fee arrangements with their home schools. All training resources are provided when classes commence. NCAT students see the Payment Form – Material Charges.

For safety reasons there is a NCAT uniform for this course which is not included in the materials cost. Parents will receive a letter outlining specific details of the uniform and the supplier.

Students also need safety glasses, earmuffs, 8m tape measure, loose leaf paper, manila or plastic assignment folders, pens, pencils and calculator.

Students enrolling as full time NCAT students must contact the college on Tel 9478 1333 for an interview. External students must apply through the VET coordinator at their home school and complete the enrolment form at the NCAT information evening.
