# 22614VIC Certificate II in Building and Construction (Carpentry) Pre-apprenticeship

(Partial Completion\*)



The program is delivered to students as a VET in Schools Vocational Major (VM) program for Year 10 or Year 11 commencements. This course is a partial completion of the Certificate with 8 core units related to the building industry and 8 elective units introducing carpentry. It covers basic knowledge in safety and basic carpentry and building skills to prepare students for work in the building trades.

- Hand and power tool skills for various carpentry projects working as part of a team.
- Timber construction projects include full scale wall framing, cladding, traditional hip and gable roof framing and sub floor.

## LENGTH OF COURSE

\*VCE VM student attend for a half day per week 8.30am-12.30pm OR 1.30pm to 5.30pm (Feb-Nov) over two years and can complete up to 16 units as a partial completion. External students enrol through their home school.

Full time NCAT students commencing in Y10 or Y11 may have the opportunity to complete the remaining units to achieve all nineteen units of competency and receive the full certificate.

#### ELIGIBILITY & PREREQUISITES

A minimum sound achievement of Year 10 Maths and English or equivalent and an aptitude for practical work is recommended. If you have individual needs, please contact the college.

#### ASSESSMENT

Practical project work assessed by observation and questioning, and written tasks are all assessed using set criteria. Students are required to undertake a minimum of 80 hours of Structured Workplace Learning.

Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.
