CUA41320 Certificate IV in Visual Arts



This qualification reflects the role of practitioners working at a pre-professional level who are beginning to develop their own artistic voice. They produce work that shows proficiency with techniques in their chosen art form and can apply solutions to a defined range of unpredictable problems. They have broad and integrated factual, technical and theoretical knowledge with cognitive skills that allow them to analyse, compare and act on information from a range of sources.

ACTIVITIES/TASKS

Delivery is via weekly practical, theory and workshop sessions. Activities include Art Projects of set workplace tasks or projects, participation in group discussions, and a final presentation on the implementation and outcomes of specified projects.

As well as completing individual job briefs, students must attend and participate in practical workshops, tests, demonstrations, lectures, presentations, excursions, exhibition/gallery visits, the creation of an online blog/website/portfolio, completion of oral presentations, "mock" interviews, self-evaluation exercises, oral presentations, podcasts, online tuition, questionnaires, and surveys.

LENGTH OF COURSE

This is a one-year program for 35 weeks. Classes are on four days a week. Three days from 9:00 – 3:15 and a fourth day 9:00 – 5:00. Students are encouraged to attend a fifth Open Studio day to work on their practical work with access to materials, equipment and a trainer. This allows time for the development of the underpinning skills and the preparation of a portfolio of practical work.

ELIGIBILITY & PREREQUISITES

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

ASSESSMENT

Learning and assessment is integrated, with assessment evidence being collected and feedback provided to the student on an ongoing basis. Core and elective subjects cover a variety of contexts using practical and some written tasks. These include group-based, work-based, project-based, self-paced work and involve practice and experience in a simulated work environment. Job Briefs outline tasks, the competencies to be demonstrated and the practical outcomes to be produced. Units of Competency are clustered as course subjects delivered over the course of the full year. The units of competency selected provide students with a folio that demonstrates the building of acquired skills and the development of a specialised portfolio.

Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.

BENEFITS OF TRAINING

This qualification prepares people for skilled work at a pre-professional level and for learning at higher levels, through visual arts qualifications at Diploma, Advanced Diploma and Degree levels.

APPLICATION & ENROLMENT PROCESS

Application is via a formal application form & interview. Prospective students must demonstrate an interest in and capacity for art practices. Phone the College on Tel 9478 1333 for an appointment. Enrolment is held at the college. Literacy, language & numeracy are tested prior to enrolment to establish individual needs.

PATHWAYS

Candidates seeking a career change use the CUA41320 Certificate IV in Visual Arts as a pathway to a career in the Visual Arts. There are no prerequisites for the Units of Competency delivered in this program. The Certificate IV in Visual Arts is a pathway to TAFE and Higher Education Design programs and/or directly to employment – particularly as self-employed artist/contemporary craftsperson. It is highly recommended applicants possess some relevant art or design skills and knowledge prior to entry. This can be demonstrated through skills in drawing or other art techniques.
