BRING IT ON!

There is a long and complicated history of women being denied rights to employment in trades and technology across the broad construction and manufacturing sectors in Australia. A group of students from the NCAT *Young Women in Trades and Technology* group together with a number of industry partners have decided to challenge that history. The young women in the group have been going out to local schools and speaking with their counterparts in Years 9-11 about what they are doing at NCAT and encouraging other young women to consider careers in these industry sectors.

On July 26 the NCAT Young Women in Trades and Technology group and their industry partners held an activity called Bring It On! The evening activity provided an opportunity for students from other schools and their parents/guardians to come into NCAT to tour the facilities, meet and hear from qualified tradeswomen, our students and their parents, local employers, industry associations and unions about the realities of studying and working in construction and manufacturing. The participants heard from a panel of speakers who represented different aspects of womens' journeys in trades and technologies. The Panel members were Lisa Zanatta, Womens Organiser, CFMEU, Laura Beata, HR Specialist, Civil Infrastructure Group, Carmel Locosa, NCAT parent and Raffaela Galati-Brown, NCAT Principal. The evening ended with refereshments and vibrant, informative conversations. There were about 40-50 in attendance and the feed-back was very positive.

The partners in the activity included the Construction, Forestry, Maritime, Mining and Energy Union (CFMEU), the Victorian Automobile Chamber of Commerce (VACC), the Australian Cabinet and Furniture Association (ACFA), New Plumbing Solutions, A & A Cabinets Impressions and the Civil Infrastructure Group.

Our students learnt about how large earthmoving equipment can now be controlled can remotely using Virtual Reality (VR) headsets and hand controllers.

Tim spoke about careers, industry, and training pathways. He was impressed with what our students were learning and saw them working on their own automation projects. NCAT and Komatsu have now formed a partnership around the delivery of the Integrated Technologies qualification and this a further example of how NCAT works closely with industry partners to deliver industry relevant training to maximise students' employability skills.



Digital Art and Visual Design Year 10 Arts


