AUR20720 Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation



The Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation provides students with knowledge and skills to increase their chances of gaining an apprenticeship, seek employment, or pursuing future training pathways in the automotive industry. The course gives students a nationally recognised certificate and helps them make an informed choice entering the automotive industry. The course covers competencies at work entry level including basic safety and skills and knowledge for work in the automotive sector.

ACTIVITIES/TASKS

During the course students perform a large variety of the basic repairs employers ask an apprentice to carry out.

The course is very hands on but there is some theory and written work for the knowledge component of the qualification. How to complete various types of workplace documentation and how to apply safe work practices are also covered.

Students work on cars:

- Dismantling and assembling engines
- Repairing and working on brakes
- Removing and replacing starter motors and alternators
- Changing wheel and tyres
- Carrying out basic servicing operations

LENGTH OF COURSE

This program is delivered to students as a VET in Schools Vocational Major (VM) program for Year 10 or Year 11 commencements. Internal NCAT students can complete the program as a NCAT Preapprenticeship student over one year.

External VCE VM students attend for a half day per week (Feb-Nov) over two years and enrol through their home school.

ELIGIBILITY & PREREQUISITES

It is recommended students have a minimum sound achievement of Year 10 Maths and English or equivalent and an aptitude for practical work. If you have any individual needs, please contact the college to discuss.

ASSESSMENT

Practical repairs and maintenance tasks assessed by observation and questioning, and written tasks are all assessed using set criteria. Students are given a fair and adequate assessment process that includes multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.

Students are required to undertake a minimum of 80 hours of Structured Workplace Learning.

BENEFITS OF TRAINING

The course covers the skills and knowledge employers are looking for when seeking new apprentices. Many of our past students have been offered jobs or apprenticeships either during their structured workplace learning placement or at the completion of the course.

PATHWAYS

The automotive industry is a fast-paced and exciting career choice. The industry employs over 300,000 people across Australia. Advances in technology have led to a growing number of career opportunities, and high vehicle sales have increased the number of vehicles requiring maintenance and repair. In turn, we are seeing a growing need for skilled tradespeople. (Victorian Automobile Chamber of Commerce)

This course provides direct pathways into apprenticeships or traineeships within the automotive industry as a mechanic specialising in light and heavy vehicles, marine mechanic, small engines, or outdoor power equipment. It is also a useful pathway to employment into the service and repair sectors, and spare parts interpreting. Credit transfers may be possible into certificate III courses.
