CUA50920 Diploma of Photography and Digital Imaging



The Diploma at NCAT Photography prepares you for a career as a photographer across a range of industry areas including commercial, domestic portrait, media, wedding, illustrative and fine art photography. This is a face-to-face course with practical, theory and workshop sessions covering digital and black and white and colour analogue processes, making it a unique course. The main aim is to produce a portfolio of work, tailored to suit the student's chosen pathway and demonstrating a high level of conceptual research, technical competence, and refinement.

ACTIVITIES/TASKS

Students work in studios, darkrooms and on location and visit galleries and photographic workplaces. Students must complete individual work briefs, participate in workshops and demonstrations, group discussions, presentations, excursions, and self-evaluation exercises. Guest speakers feature and maintain our strong connection to a dynamic industry and educational pathway.

LENGTH OF COURSE

This one-year course runs over four terms from early Febuary to late October. Students must attend six hours a day four days a week. We strongly encourage students to work independently on the fifth day to complete set technical tasks and develop skills and knowledge under supervision.

ELIGIBILITY & PREREQUISITES

Completion of the Certificate IV in Photography and • Digital Imaging is highly recommended. Candidates • must demonstrate skills that support learning at a diploma level in an interview and evidence of:

- an ability to respond effectively to different photo imaging challenges and requirements and a capacity to refine concepts and images in line with current industry standards.
- engaging with the design process, solving problems by research and generation and refinement of ideas
- knowledge of the photo imaging industry trends and traditions

- technical photo imaging knowledge and skills
- use of a range of professional digital and/or film cameras and accessories for image capture
- use of professional camera and lighting equipment for a range of subjects in different physical environments
- enhancing and manipulating techniques using current industry standard software
- use of electronic processing techniques.

Skills and knowledge may have been acquired through personal experience, work, or Certificate level study.

ASSESSMENT

Learning and assessment is integrated. Evidence is collected and feedback provided to students on an ongoing basis. Subjects cover a variety of contexts and use a range of strategies to meet learner needs. These include group-based, work-based, project-based, self-paced tasks. Training involves practice and experience in our studios and darkrooms which are a simulated work environment. Job briefs outline the tasks, the competencies to be demonstrated and the required practical outcomes. Students will be given a fair and adequate assessment process and multiple opportunities to demonstrate competency.

PATHWAYS INTO THE QUALIFICATION

NCAT requires applicants have the Certificate IV in Photography and Digital Imaging or experience in Photo Imaging, as part of a certificate IV in Visual Arts or Design with a focus on photo media or have relevant employment experience in the photography field.

COURSE FEES
